Course Description

The Master of Professional Accounting Advanced (MPAA) program is a 2-year full-time (or equivalent part-time for domestic students only) qualification co-designed with industry experts to provide the opportunity for students to develop a unique, future-proofed skill set, gain real-world experience and be better equipped to solve complex accounting and business problems, work collaboratively with others, and drive organisational performance.

To fulfill the requirement of the award students must complete a total of 160 credit points or 16 units, 14 core and 2 electives units, each unit is 10 credit points.

Career Prospects

The Master of Professional Accounting Advanced program prepares graduates for various accounting roles, including business advisory services, taxation, consulting, and financial analysis. Graduates may work in areas such as auditing, accounting, policy formulation, and strategic planning. The program aligns with the accreditation requirements of CPAA/CA ANZ/IPA so that the degree will provide CPAA/CA ANZ/IPA accreditation for students upon successful completion of the course.

What you will study

Our comprehensive course is designed to provide a thorough understanding of the principles of accounting, which serves as the language of business. Our curriculum concentrates on evaluating specialized accounting concepts and applying accounting information to support decision-making and plan for future business activity.

Our program covers financial accounting and reporting, data analytics, and accounting information systems to help you develop expertise in these areas. Additionally, we prioritize studies in sustainability, ESG, and business ethics

to ensure a well-rounded knowledge and understanding of accounting theory and practice is achieved. Our program also includes advanced financial accounting, auditing and assurance, managerial accounting, and taxation law to prepare students for their roles as professional accountants in the modern business world. We'll equip you with the skills you need to succeed with courses in business analysis and valuation, management information systems, and two electives.

The Way You Will Study

Our teaching model features small class sizes and face-to-face interaction with subject matter expert lecturers. Course materials are provided online, although personal connections with lecturers are emphasized. We also offer various clubs and societies for students to enjoy, including instrumental music, table tennis, and entrepreneurship.

Admission requirements

To satisfy the general entrance requirements for admission to the MPA course, applicants must meet at least one of the following entry requirements:

Domestic applicants with a noncognate AQF7 credential:

- Successful completion of a non-accounting undergraduate degree (AQF Level 7) in any discipline from an Australian university or AQF equivalent from an overseas institution delivered in English with a grade point average in a undergraduate program of at least 2.4, where the range is four, and an equivalent proportion for other ranges.

Domestic applicants with a cognate AQF7 credential:

- Successful completion of an Australian recognised Bachelor of Accounting (BOA) or equivalent qualification delivered in English

- with a grade point average in a undergraduate program of at least 2.4, where the range is four, and an equivalent proportion for other ranges or
- Successful completion of an Australian recognised Graduate Certificate of Accounting or Graduate Diploma of Accounting or their equivalent qualification delivered in English with a grade point average in a undergraduate program of at least 2.4, where the range is four, and an equivalent proportion for other ranges or

Without a cognate AQF7 credential:

- Equivalent professional evidence of a minimum of two years of relevant industry experience which will allow domestic applicants to apply for RPL based on industry experience.

International Applicants:

- International students must meet the conditions above.
- In addition, international students whose first language is not English must demonstrate competency in the English language. English proficiency can be demonstrated by providing proof of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) overall test result (or equivalent alternative test result as defined by regulation) that meets the specified level of English proficiency specified for the course: IELTS, a minimum overall score of 6.5 with no band less than 6.0, TOEFL Internet-based Test (iBT), a minimum overall score of 79 with a minimum writing score of 21. Pearson PTE Academic, a minimum overall score of 58 with no score lower than 50, or recognised equivalency.
- Where an international student has achieved an AQF qualification or equivalent overseas qualification and where the language of instruction is English, students are deemed to have met the English language fluency requirement.
